LOCATION

The Orange County Figure Skating Club Open Championships will be held at the Orange County Ice Palace, located at 23641 La Palma Boulevard Yorba Linda, CA 92887

FACILITIES

The ice surface at the Orange County Ice Palace is 185 feet long and 85 feet wide with slightly rounded corners and is completely indoors.

SANCTION

The Orange County Figure Skating Club Open Championships are sanctioned by US Figure Skating. The competition will be conducted according to the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009, and any changes pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action.

EVENTS

The events to be included in this competition are:

- *Compulsories*
- *Free Skating**
- *Pairs*
- *Dance Couples*
- *Solo Dance*
- *Artistic*
- *Adult Events*
- *Competitive Test Track Events**

* A skater may enter either the test track events or the standard (well balanced program) free skating events but not both.

ELIGIBILITY

Test qualifications will be effective as of July 13, 2009, the closing date for entries. Age as of the closing date for entries July 13, 2009, shall determine eligibility in categories where age is a determining factor.

ENTRIES

Please note the similarity in test requirements for the following events and make certain that the desired event is the one marked on the entry form:

- *Sugar Babies/Gum Drops*
- *Lemon Drops/Orange Twists*

Entries of partners must be submitted together. Entries may have to be limited and will be accepted in the order received. Entry forms are attached and must be filled out completely and **received by** the registrar by Monday, July 13, 2009, accompanied by a check or money order. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Orange County Figure Skating Club Competition Committee. Any late entries accepted must include a \$35.00 late fee.

Entry fees shall be payable to the ORANGE COUNTY FIGURE SKATING CLUB. A \$45.00 charge will be made for all checks returned by the bank for any reason. If the bank returns your check, the only method of payment accepted will be cash, cashier's check or money order. Pursuant to US Figure Skating Rule 3235, entry fees will be refunded only if the event is not held.

REGISTRATION

A registration desk will be set up one hour prior to the first event. All entrants are required to register and be ready to skate at least one hour prior to their scheduled event.

NOTICE/ SCHEDULE

An official bulletin board will be maintained at the competition arena and all notices posted shall be considered sufficient notice to competitors. Please check bulletin board for time changes. The Orange County Figure Skating Club also maintains a website www.Orange County FSC.org All information regarding this event will be posted at this site. A tentative schedule of events, groups and practice ice will be posted to the Orange County FSC official web site within a reasonable period of time after the close of entries. Please note the referee may begin the competition events up to 30 minutes early.

RULES

Two entries in a category will constitute a scheduled event to be skated. Skaters in events with only one entry will be advised shortly after the close of entries and given the options of skating up a level, if applicable; skating an exhibition for full fee (short program, free skating, artistic only); or refund of their entry fee. If a skater or pair wishes to skate an exhibition, they will have the option of being critiqued by the judges. If requesting a critique, they should specify short program or free skating, if applicable. They must respond to the registrar within 72 hours. Failing to do so, they will be deemed to have opted for a refund of their entry fee. Events below Pre-Preliminary with more than 10 skaters and Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile with more than 12 skaters will be divided into groups by age. Juvenile and above events with more than 24 skaters will be divided into groups by random draw. If an event is divided into groups there will be no final round. Events may be combined or divided at the discretion of the referee. The referee, along with the chairperson, shall have the right to exclude any person whose behavior is unruly and/or un-sportsmanlike. The decisions of the referee on all matters will be final.

JUDGING

The International System of Judging will be used for all Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior, Senior Adult Gold and Adult Masters Free Skating, Singles, Pairs and Couples Dance. Skaters must submit a planned program content sheet for all events entered that use the New Judging System. The 6.0 System will be used for all Artistic Events, Solo Dance Events, Adult Pre-Bronze through Adult Pre-Gold Events, Sugar Babies through Pre-Juvenile Events, and all Competitive Test Track Events. In all events, the closed system of judging will be used with the number of judges on a panel to be at least three, but no more than nine. The referee in accordance with the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009, and any changes pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action, will resolve items not specified in this announcement.

MUSIC

All competitors except dancers must provide their own music on cassettes or CD's only. The cassette or CD must be clearly marked with the name, event and side to be played, with one program per CD or cassette tape. **No CD-RW CD's will be accepted. Cassette tapes must be rewound and ready to play.** Music must be turned in one hour prior to the event being skated. **Cassette tapes and CD's are to be picked up promptly at the conclusion of each event at the registration desk. The committee cannot be responsible for tapes not picked up.**

DURATION OF SKATING

Ten seconds over or under the specified time for free skating and compulsory skating programs will be allowed. ***EXCEPTION: This does not apply to short programs or adult events. The time specified for all short programs ,adult events, Gum Drops and Lemon Drops free skating and all Artistic events is the MAXIMUM allowable time.***

WARM -UP TIME

For all events below Juvenile, the warm-up time for free skating may be limited to twice the specified length of the program with a three-minute minimum.

AWARDS

Trophies will be presented to first place in each division. Medals will be presented to second, third and fourth place in each division.

All Orange County Figure Skating Club members are eligible for the ***Dinger Family Artistic Award Trophy***, which is judged by a special panel during the competition. The winner of this award will be announced at the end of the competition. Previous winners are ineligible.

In all categories having perpetual trophies, the trophy will be engraved with the winner's name. The perpetual trophy will remain with the club and a "take home" trophy will be awarded to the winner.

PRACTICE ICE

Practice ice will be available in the morning on the day of the competition. Please complete the attached practice ice form and submit it to the Practice Ice Chairman by the close of entries. Practice ice assignments will be posted on the Orange County FSC official website www.OrangeCountyFSC.org ***Prior to the day of competition***, practice ice may be obtained through the management of the Yorba Linda Ice Palace, Yorba Linda, CA.

LIABILITY

All adult entrants 18 years of age or older, are required to sign the Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability form. All parents or legal guardians of minor entrants under 18 years of age are required to sign the Consent of Parent or Guardian form. These forms are printed on the attached pages and must be completed prior to skating.

ADMISSION

There will be no admission charged. All skaters are encouraged to invite family and friends.

FREE SKATING EVENTS

SUGAR BABIES (Girls/Boys)

Open to skaters who have not passed the Pre-Preliminary Moves in the Field, Pre-Preliminary Free Skating test or the Preliminary Figure test and who are six years of age and under as July 13, 2009. **Boys and Girls may compete against one another in this event.** The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for this event.

Compulsory Program (Unspecified without music)

The Compulsory Program must be performed as a continuous program with all elements performed **once** in any order. No additional elements may be added. Program is to be skated on one-half of the ice surface **without music**. The Compulsory Program consists of the following five elements.

- Marching while moving
- Two foot jump in place
- Forward swizzles -- standing still (three times)
- Moving swizzles (three times)
- Dip

GUM DROPS (Girls/Boys)

Open to skaters who have not passed the Pre-Preliminary Moves in the Field, Pre-Preliminary Free Skating test or the Preliminary Figure test and who are six years of age and under as of July 13, 2009. **Boys and Girls may compete against one another in this event.** The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (One minute ten seconds maximum with music)

The Free Skating must be performed as a continuous program with all listed elements performed **once** in any order. No additional elements may be added. Program is to be skated on the full ice surface **with music**.

- Snowplow stop, one or two foot
- Forward swizzles (minimum three)
- Bunny hop
- Backward Wiggles (minimum three)
- Dip

Two marks will be awarded for Required Elements and Presentation with the mark for Required Elements breaking ties.

LEMON DROPS (Girls/Boys)

The Compulsory Program is open to skaters who have not passed the Pre-Preliminary Moves in the Field. The Free Skating is open to skaters who have not passed the Pre-Preliminary Free Skating test. **The Compulsory Program and the Free Skating are separate events. Boys and Girls may compete against one another in the Compulsory Program and the Free Skating.** The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for these events.

Compulsory Program (Unspecified without music)

The Compulsory Program must be performed as a continuous program with all elements performed **once** in any order. No additional elements may be added. The Compulsory Program consists of the following six elements. No additional elements may be added. Program is to be skated on one-half of the ice surface **without music**.

- Forward spiral (either foot)
- Waltz jump
- Two foot upright spin (minimum three revolutions either edge or flat)
- T-Stop (either foot or edge)

- Half-flip
- Consecutive forward inside edges (minimum two on each foot)

Free Skating (One minute 40 seconds maximum)

No jumps of one revolution or greater are permitted except single toe loop, single salchow and half loop. Jump combinations or sequences are not required but no more than three in total are permitted. A minimum of one spin with a minimum of three revolutions is required. No jump spins allowed. Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated.

ORANGE TWISTS (Girls/Boys)

The Compulsory Program is open to skaters who have not passed the Pre-Preliminary Moves in the Field. The Free Skating is open to skaters who have not passed the Pre-Preliminary Free Skating test. ***The Compulsory Program and the Free Skating are separate events. Boys and Girls may compete against one another in the Compulsory Program and the Free Skating.*** The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for these events.

Compulsory Program (Unspecified without music)

The Compulsory Program must be performed as a continuous program with all elements performed **once** in any order. No additional elements may be added. The Compulsory Program consists of the following five elements. Program is to be skated on one-half of the ice surface **without music**.

- Forward outside Spiral (either foot)
- Salchow jump
- One foot upright spin (minimum three revolutions)
- Flip jump
- Consecutive backward outside edges (minimum two each foot)

Free Skating (One minute 30 seconds)

The Free Skating Program shall be accordance with 3721 of the current US Figure Skating Rulebook, except jump spins are not permitted.

PRE-PRELIMINARY (Girls/Boys)

The Compulsory Program is open to skaters who have not passed the Preliminary Moves in the Field. The Free Skating is open to skaters who have not passed the Preliminary Free Skating test. ***The Compulsory Program and the Free Skating are separate events. Boys and Girls may compete against one another in the Compulsory Program only.*** The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for these events.

Compulsory Program (Unspecified without music)

The Compulsory Program must be performed as a continuous program with all elements performed **once** in any order, ***except a Move in the Field must be skated in its entirety before proceeding to a jump, a spin or another Move in the Field.*** No additional elements may be added. Program is to be skated on one-half of the ice surface **without music**. The Compulsory Program consists of the following four elements.

- CONSECUTIVE BACKWARD INSIDE EDGES (minimum four) (TR 25.01(2); PPM Pattern 2)
- Single Toe Loop jump
- WALTZ EIGHT (TR 25.01(4); PPM Pattern 4)
- One-foot upright spin (minimum four revolutions)

Free Skating (One minute 30 seconds)

The Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with 3711 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009.

PRELIMINARY (Girls/Boys)

The Compulsory Program is open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Preliminary Moves in the Field but not the Pre-Juvenile Moves in the Field. The Free Skating is open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Preliminary Free Skating test but not the Pre-Juvenile Free Skating test. ***The Compulsory Program and the***

Free Skating are separate events. Boys and Girls may compete against one another in the Compulsory Program only. The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for these events.

Compulsory Program (Unspecified without music)

The Compulsory Program must be performed as a continuous program with all elements performed **once** in any order, **except a Move in the Field must be skated in its entirety before proceeding to a jump, a spin or another Move in the Field.** No additional elements may be added. Program is to be skated on the full ice surface **without music.** The Compulsory Program consists of the following four elements..

- CONSECUTIVE OUTSIDE AND INSIDE SPIRALS (TR 25.02(2); PM Pattern 2)
- ALTERNATING FORWARD 3-TURNS (TR 25.02(4); PM Pattern 4)
- Loop jump
- Sit spin (minimum three revolutions in position)

Free Skating (One minute 30 seconds)

The Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with 3700 - 3701 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action.

PRE-JUVENILE (Girls/Boys)

The Compulsory Program is open to skaters who have passed the Preliminary Moves in the Field but not the Juvenile Moves in the Field. The Free Skating is open to skaters who have passed the Preliminary Free Skating test but not the Juvenile Free Skating test. **The Compulsory Program and the Free Skating are separate events. Boys and girls may compete against one another in the Compulsory Program only.** The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for these events.

Compulsory Program (Unspecified without music)

The Compulsory Program must be performed as a continuous program with all elements performed **once** in any order, **except a Move in the Field must be skated in its entirety before proceeding to a jump, a spin or another Move in the Field.** No additional elements may be added. Program is to be skated on the full ice surface **without music.** The Compulsory Program consists of the following four elements.

- FORWARD OUTSIDE-BACK INSIDE 3-TURNS IN THE FIELD (TR 25.03(3); PJM Pattern 3)
- FIVE STEP MOHAWK SEQUENCE (TR 25.03(6); PJM Pattern 6)
- Single Lutz jump
- A Combination spin with no change of foot and only one change of position. Any two positions allowed. (a minimum of three revolutions each position)

Free Skating (Two minutes)

The Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with 3690-3691 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action, (except the double Lutz and double Axel are not permitted.)

JUVENILE (Girls/Boys)

Open to skaters who are under 13 years of age as July 13, 2009. The Compulsory Program is open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Juvenile Moves in the Field but not the Intermediate Moves in the Field. The Free Skating is open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Juvenile Free Skating test but not the Intermediate Free Skating test. **The Compulsory Program and the Free Skating are separate events. Boys and Girls may compete against one another in the Compulsory Program only.** The International System of Judging will be used for the free skating events. The 6.0 system will be used for the compulsory events.

Compulsory Program (Unspecified without music)

The Compulsory Program must be performed as a continuous program with all elements performed **once** in any order, **except a Move in the Field must be skated in its entirety before proceeding to a jump, a spin or**

another Move in the Field. No additional elements may be added. Program is to be skated on the full ice surface ***without music.*** The Compulsory Program consists of the following four elements.

- EIGHT STEP MOHAWK SEQUENCE (TR 25.04(1); JM Pattern 1)
- FORWARD DOUBLE 3-TURNS (TR 25.04(4); JM Pattern 4)
- Jump combination of any two single jumps, including Axel. All references of Axel jump include one foot Axel and inside Axel.
- A combination spin with only one change of foot. Positions are free. (minimum four revolutions each foot)

Free Skating (Two minutes fifteen seconds)

The Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with 3680-3681 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009.

OPEN JUVENILE (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are at least 13 years of age, but who have not reached the age of 21 years as of July 13, 2009. The Compulsory Program is open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Juvenile Moves in the Field but not the Intermediate Moves in the Field. The Free Skating is open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Juvenile Free Skating test but not the Intermediate Free Skating test. **The Compulsory Program and the Free Skating are separate events. Boys and Girls may compete against one another in the Compulsory Program only.** The International System of Judging will be used for the free skating events. The 6.0 system will be used for the compulsory events.

Compulsory Program (Unspecified without music)

The Compulsory Program must be performed as a continuous program with all elements performed **once** in any order, ***except a Move in the Field must be skated in its entirety before proceeding to a jump, a spin or another Move in the Field.*** No additional elements may be added. Program is to be skated on the full ice surface ***without music.*** The Compulsory Program consists of the following four elements.

- EIGHT STEP MOHAWK SEQUENCE (TR 25.04(1); JM Pattern 1)
- FORWARD DOUBLE 3-TURNS (TR 25.04(4); JM Pattern 4)
- Jump combination of any two single jumps, including Axel. All references of Axel jump include one foot Axel and inside Axel.
- A combination spin with only one change of foot. Positions are free. (**minimum** four revolutions each foot)

Free Skating (Two minutes fifteen seconds)

The Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with 3680-3681 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009.

INTERMEDIATE (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are under 18 years of age as of July 13, 2009. The Free Skating is open to skaters who have passed the Juvenile Free Skating test but not the Novice Free Skating test. The Intermediate Free Skating event shall consist of a Short Program and a Free Skating Program. Required elements shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3670-3671 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009.

The International System of Judging will be used for these events.

Short Program (Two minutes maximum)

Free Skating (Two minutes 30 seconds)

NOVICE (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who have passed the Intermediate Free Skating test but not the Junior Free Skating test. The Novice Free Skating event shall consist of a Short Program and a Free Skating Program. Required elements for the Short Program will be those listed in 3660-3662 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3663 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new

season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for these events.

Short Program (Men/Ladies Two minutes 30 seconds maximum)
Free Skating (Men Three minutes 30 seconds) (Ladies Three minutes)

JUNIOR (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who have passed the Novice Free Skating test, but not the Senior Free Skating test. The Junior Free Skating event shall consist of a Short Program and a Free Skating Program. Required elements for the Short Program will be those listed in 3640-3642 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The Short Program to be skated will be Group B. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3653 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for these events.

Short Program (Men/Ladies Two minutes 50 seconds maximum)
Free Skating (Men Four minutes) (Ladies Three minutes 30 seconds)

SENIOR (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who have passed the Junior Free Skating test or higher. The Senior Free Skating event shall consist of a Short Program and a Free Skating Program. Required elements for the Short Program will be those listed in 3641-3642 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3643 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for these events.

Short program (Men/Ladies Two minutes 50 seconds maximum)
Free Skating (Men Four minutes 30 seconds) (Ladies Four minutes)

ADULT PRE-BRONZE (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009, and who have passed no higher than the Adult Pre-Bronze/ Pre-Preliminary Free Skating test. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3806 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating Men/Ladies (One minute and 40 seconds maximum)

ADULT BRONZE (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009, and who have passed the Adult Pre-Bronze Free Skating test and no higher than the Adult Bronze/Preliminary Free Skating test. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3801 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating Men/Ladies (One minute and 40 seconds maximum)

ADULT SILVER (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009, who have passed the Adult Bronze Free Skating test and no higher than the Adult Silver/Juvenile Free Skating test. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3791 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating Men/Ladies (Two minutes 10 seconds maximum)

ADULT GOLD (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009, who have passed the Adult Silver Free Skating test and no higher than the Adult Gold/ Juvenile Free Skating test. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3781 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating Men/Ladies (Two minutes 40 seconds maximum)

ADULT MASTERS NOVICE (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009, who have passed at least the standard Intermediate Free Skating test, or prior to October 1, 1977, the 3rd Figure test, and no higher than the standard Novice Free Skating test, or prior to October 1, 1977, the 5th Figure test. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3771 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating Men/Ladies (Three minutes 40 seconds maximum)

ADULT MASTERS JUNIOR (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009, who have passed at least the standard Novice Free Skating test, or prior to October 1, 1977, the 4th Figure test, and no higher than the standard Junior Free Skating test, or prior to October 1, 1977, the 7th Figure test. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3761 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating Men/Ladies (Three minutes 40 seconds maximum)

ADULT MASTERS SENIOR (Men/Ladies)

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009, who have passed at least the Junior Free Skating test, or prior to October 1, 1977, the 6th Figure test. The Free Skating content shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 3751 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating Men/Ladies (Three minutes 40 seconds maximum)

COMPETITIVE TEST TRACK EVENTS

Competitors must be 20 years of age or younger.

All levels shall consist of a Free Skating program only. There will be no Short Programs.

If there are more than 18 entries in an event, the event will be divided by age. There will be no final rounds.

All events will be judged using the 6.0 judging system.

All program times are ± 10 seconds.

Penalties:

- 0.1 each mark for each illegal element
- 0.1 each mark per 10 seconds time violation
- 0.1 in 1st mark for insufficient revolutions
- 0.1 in 1st mark for step sequence not fully utilizing the ice, Pre-Juvenile and above
- 0.2 in 1st mark for each technical element not permitted in the event description

SENIOR FREE SKATING (Men/Ladies) TEST TRACK

Competitors must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Junior Free Skating Test or higher.

Program Time: Men 4:30, Ladies 4:00

Jumps	Men: Maximum of eight (8) jump elements including at least four (4) different double jumps, one of which must be a double Lutz. Jump combinations and sequences are allowed. Ladies: Maximum of seven (7) jump elements including at least four (4) different double jumps, one of which must be a double Lutz. Jump combinations and sequences are allowed.
Spins	Four (4) spins, of which one must be a spin combination consisting of all three positions and one change of foot (minimum 2 revolutions in each position and 5 on each foot), one a flying spin and one a spin with only one position. Minimum six (6) revolutions are required for spins other than the combination spins.
Steps	Men: Two step sequences of a different nature. Ladies: One step sequence and one spiral sequence. See Rule 3640 for descriptions.

JUNIOR FREE SKATING (Men/Ladies) TEST TRACK

Competitors must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Novice Free Skating Test but not the Senior Free Skating Test.

Program Time: Men 4:00, Ladies 3:30

Jumps	Men: Maximum of eight (8) jump elements including any single jumps and double jumps may only be the double Salchow, double toe loop, double loop and double flip. Jump combinations and sequences are allowed. Ladies: Maximum of seven (7) jump elements including any single jumps and double jumps may only be the double Salchow, double toe loop, double loop and double flip. Jump combinations and sequences are allowed.
Spins	Three (3) spins, of which one must be a spin combination consisting of all three positions and one change of foot (minimum 2 revolutions in each position and 5 on each foot), one a flying spin and one a spin with only one position. Minimum six (6) revolutions are required for spins other than the combination spins.
Steps	Men/Ladies: One step sequence of advanced difficulty, covering the full ice. See rule 3643 and 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action

NOVICE FREE SKATING (Men/Ladies) TEST TRACK

Competitors must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skating Test but not the Junior Free Skating Test.

Program Time: Men 3:30, Ladies 3:00

Jumps	Maximum of seven (7) jump elements including any single jumps and double jumps may only be the double Salchow, double toe loop and double loop. Jump combinations and sequences are allowed.

Spins	Three (3) spins in any position of which one must be a spin combination with at least one change of foot (minimum 2 revolutions in each position and 5 on each foot). All spins may have flying entries. Minimum six (6) revolutions are required for spins other than the combination spin(s).

INTERMEDIATE FREE SKATING Men/Ladies) TEST TRACK

JUVENILE/OPEN JUVENILE FREE SKATING (Girls/Boys) TEST TRACK

Competitors must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test but not the Intermediate Free Skating Test.

Program Time: 2:15

Jumps	Maximum of six (6) jump elements including any single jumps, Axel permitted. Jump combinations and sequences are allowed.
Spins	Three (3) spins in any position of which one must be a spin combination with at least one change of foot (minimum 2 revolutions in each position and 4 on each foot). All spins may have flying entries. Minimum four (4) revolutions are required for spins other than the combination spin(s).
Steps	One step sequence straight line, circular or serpentine fully utilizing the ice surface.

PRE-JUVENILE FREE SKATING (Girls/Boys) TEST TRACK

Competitors must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the Juvenile Free Skating Test.

Program Time: 2:00

Jumps	Maximum of six (6) jump elements including any single jumps, Axel not permitted. Jump combinations and sequences are allowed.
Spins	Three (3) spins in any position of which one must be a spin combination (minimum 2 revolutions in each position and, with an optional change of foot, 3 on each foot or 6 total). Minimum four (4) revolutions are required for spins other than the combination spin(s). Flying spins are not allowed.
Steps	One step sequence straight line, circular or serpentine fully utilizing the ice surface.

PRELIMINARY FREE SKATING (Girls/Boys) TEST TRACK

Competitors must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test.

Program Time: 1:30

Jumps	Maximum of five (5) jump elements including any single jumps. Axel <u>not</u> permitted. Jump combinations and sequences are allowed.
Spins	Minimum of two (2) spins of a different nature. Spin combinations are allowed, (minimum 2 revolutions in each position and 3 on each foot or 6 total). Minimum three (3) revolutions are required for spins other than the combination spin(s). Flying spins are not allowed.
Steps	Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program.

PRE-PRELIMINARY FREE SKATING (Girls/Boys)TEST TRACK

Competitors must not have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating Test.

Program Time: 1:30

Jumps	Maximum of five (5) jump elements, all single jumps, Axel <u>not</u> permitted. Jump combinations and sequences using only a waltz jump, toe loop and/or Salchow are allowed.
Spins	Minimum of two (2) spins of a different nature with only one position. Minimum three (3) revolutions are required. Flying spins are not allowed.
Steps	Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program.

BEGINNER (Girls/Boys)TEST TRACK

Competitors must not have passed higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills Free Skating Badge Tests.

Program Time: 1:30

Jumps	Maximum of five (5) jump elements including any half revolution jumps plus Salchow and toe loop. Jump combinations and sequences are not permitted.
Spins	Spins in an upright position. Minimum three (3) revolutions are required. Flying spins are not allowed.
Steps	Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program.

LIMITED BEGINNER (Girls/Boys)TEST TRACK

Competitors must not have passed higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills Free Skating Badge Tests.

Program Time: 1:30

Jumps	Maximum of five (5) jump elements including any half revolution jumps. Jump combinations and sequences are not permitted.
Spins	Spins in an upright position. Minimum three (3) revolutions are required. Flying spins are not allowed.
Steps	Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program.

PAIR EVENTS

PRELIMINARY

Neither partner may have passed the Pre-Juvenile Pair test. Elements will be in accordance with those specified in 4101 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009. The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (One minute 30 seconds)

PRE-JUVENILE

Open to skaters who are under 14 years of age as of July 13, 2009. Neither partner may have passed the Juvenile Pair test. Elements will be in accordance with those specified in 4091 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action. The 6.0 System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (Two minutes)

JUVENILE

Open to skaters who are under 16 years of age as of July 13, 2009. Neither partner may have passed the Intermediate Pair test. Elements will be in accordance with those specified in 4081 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (Two minutes 30 seconds)

INTERMEDIATE

Open to skaters who have not reached the age of 18 years as of July 13, 2009. Both partners must have passed the Juvenile Pair test. Neither partner may have passed the Novice Pair test. Elements will be in accordance with the elements specified in 4071 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action.. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (Three minutes)

NOVICE

Both partners must have passed the Intermediate Pair test. Neither partner may have passed the Junior Pair test. The novice pair event shall consist of a Short Program and Free Skating. Required elements for the Short Program will be those listed in 4061 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action. The Short Program to be skated will be Group A. Content of the Free Skating program shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 4062 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Short Program (Two minutes 50 seconds maximum)

Free Skating (Three minutes 30 seconds)

JUNIOR

Both partners must have passed the Novice Pair test. Neither partner may have passed the Senior Pair test. The junior pair event shall consist of a Short Program and Free Skating. Required elements for the Short Program will be those listed in 4051 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book. The Short Program to be skated will be Group A. Content of the Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with the elements

specified in 4052 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book and the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Short Program (Two minutes 50 seconds maximum)
Free Skating (Four minutes)

SENIOR

Both partners must have passed the Junior Pair test. The senior pair event shall consist of a Short Program and Free Skating. Required elements for the Short Program will be those listed in 4041 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book. The Short Program to be skated will be Group A. Content of the Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 4042 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Short Program (Two minutes 50 seconds maximum)
Free Skating (Four minutes 30 seconds)

ADULT BRONZE

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009. Both partners must have passed at least one of the following tests: the Adult Bronze Pairs test and no higher; the Adult Bronze Free Skating test and no higher; the standard Preliminary Pairs test and /or the standard Pre-Juvenile Pairs test and no higher; or the standard Preliminary Free Skating test and/or the standard Pre-Juvenile Free Skating test and no higher. Content of the Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 4125 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, and the new season requirements, commencing, July 1, 2009, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (Two minutes 10 seconds maximum)

ADULT SILVER

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009. One partner must have passed at least one of the following tests: the Adult Silver Pairs test and no higher; the Adult Silver Free Skating test and no higher; the standard Pre- Juvenile Free Skating test and no higher. The other partner must meet the requirements for this level or must have passed no less than one level lower (Adult Bronze Pairs test, Adult Bronze Free Skating test, standard Preliminary Pairs test, and no higher than the standard Pre-Juvenile Pairs test, or standard Preliminary Free Skating test or standard Pre-Juvenile Free Skating test). Content of the Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 4123 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book , the new season requirements, commencing, July 1,2009, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (Two minutes 40 seconds maximum)

ADULT GOLD

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009. One partner must have passed at least one of the following tests: the Adult Gold Pair test and no higher; the Adult Gold Free Skating test and no higher; the standard Juvenile Pairs test and no higher; or the standard Juvenile Free Skating test and no higher. The other partner must meet the requirements for this level or must have passed no less than one level lower (Adult Silver Pairs test, Adult Silver Free Skating test, standard Juvenile Pairs test, or standard Pre-Juvenile Free Skating test). Content of the Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 4121 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009, and any requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (Three minutes 40 seconds maximum)

ADULT MASTERS

Open to skaters who are 21 years of age or over as of July 13, 2009. One partner must have passed at least one of the following tests: the Adult Gold Pairs test, but not the standard Intermediate Pairs test; the Adult Gold Free Skating test; the standard Juvenile Pairs test, but no higher; the standard Juvenile Free Skating test and no higher. The other partner must meet the requirements for this level or must have passed no less than one level lower (Adult Silver Pairs test, Adult Silver Free Skating test, the standard Preliminary or Pre-Juvenile Pairs test, or standard Pre-Juvenile Free Skating test). Content of the Free Skating Program shall be in accordance with the elements specified in 4116 of the current US Figure Skating Rule Book, the new season requirements, commencing July 1, 2009, and any other requirements pursuant to the 2008-09 Governing Council Combined Report of Action. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

Free Skating (Three minutes 40 seconds maximum)

DANCE COUPLES EVENTS

All compulsory dances will be skated in the order listed. The number of sequences of each compulsory dance shall be as specified in 4231. Both partners of couples entering Adult Dance events must be 21 years or older as of July 13, 2009. Dance test requirements for Adult Dance events refer to Standard or Adult Tests.

PRE-JUVENILE DANCE

Open to couples, each under 14 years of age as of July 13, 2009. Both partners must have passed the Preliminary Moves in the Field Test or higher and two (2) Preliminary Dances but no higher than Pre-Bronze Test. Pre-Juvenile Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated are the Dutch Waltz and the Cha-Cha. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.

JUVENILE DANCE

Open to couples, each under 16 years of age as of July 13, 2009. Both partners must have passed the Juvenile Moves in the Field Test or higher, the Preliminary Dance Test or higher, and the Juvenile Free Dance Test. Juvenile Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated will be drawn from the following three: Swing Dance, Hickory Hoedown, Fourteenstep. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

INTERMEDIATE DANCE

Open to couples each under 18 years of age as of July 13, 2009. Both partners must have passed the Intermediate Moves in the Field Test or higher, the Bronze Dance Test or higher, and the Intermediate Free Dance Test. Intermediate Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated will be drawn from the following three: Fourteenstep, Foxtrot, American Waltz. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

NOVICE DANCE

Both partners must have passed the Novice Moves in the Field Test or higher, at least one dance of the Silver Dance Test and the Novice Free Dance Test. Novice Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated will be drawn from the following three: Starlight Waltz, Tango, Kilian. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

JUNIOR DANCE

Both partners must have passed the Junior Moves in the Field Test or higher, at least two Pre-Gold Dances and the Junior Free Dance Test. Junior Dance shall consist of one Compulsory Dance. The dance to be skated will be drawn from the following two: Westminster Waltz, Argentine Tango. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

SENIOR DANCE

Both partners must have passed the Senior Moves in the Field Test and the Gold Dance Test. Senior Dance shall consist of one Compulsory Dance. The dance to be skated will be drawn from the following two: Golden Waltz, Tango Romantica. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

ADULT PRE-BRONZE DANCE

Open to couples who are 21 years or older as of July 13, 2009. Both partners must have completed the Pre-Bronze Dance test, but no higher than the Bronze Dance Test. Adult Pre-Bronze Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated are the Cha-Cha and the Dutch Waltz. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.

ADULT BRONZE DANCE

Open to couples who are 21 years or older as of July 13, 2009. One partner must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Pre-Silver Dance; the other partner must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Bronze Dance. Neither partner may have passed more than one Silver/Adult Silver Dance. Adult Bronze Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated are the Cha-Cha and the Ten-fox. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.

ADULT PRE-SILVER DANCE

Open to couples who are 21 years or older as of July 13, 2009. Both partners must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Pre-Silver Dance. Neither partner may have passed more than one Standard, Adult or Masters Silver Dance. Adult Pre-Silver Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated are the Willow Waltz and the Foxtrot. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.

ADULT SILVER DANCE

Open to couples who are 21 years or older as of July 13, 2009. One partner must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Silver Dance; the other partner must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Pre-Silver Dance. Neither partner may have passed more than one Pre-Gold/Adult Pre-Gold Dance. Adult Silver Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated are the Foxtrot and the Tango. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.

ADULT PRE-GOLD DANCE

Open to couples who are 21 years or older as of July 13, 2009. One partner must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Pre-Gold Dance; the other partner must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Silver Dance. Neither partner may have completed the Gold/Adult Gold Dance. Adult Pre-Gold Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated are the Rocker Foxtrot and the Kilian. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.

ADULT GOLD DANCE

Open to couples who are 21 years or older as of July 13, 2009. One partner must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Gold Dance; the other partner must have passed at least one Standard, Adult or Masters Pre-Gold Dance. Any skater who has passed one or more Pre-Gold Dances prior to age 21 or has competed at a standard track qualifying dance event at Sectionals or higher before or after the age of 21 will be ineligible to compete in this event. Adult Gold Dance shall consist of two Compulsory Dances. The dances to be skated are the Paso Doble and the Westminster Waltz. The International System of Judging will be used for this event.

SOLO DANCE EVENTS

In Solo Dance events, Boys and Girls/Men and Ladies may enter the same event. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for these events.

RHYTHM BLUES

Open to skaters who have passed the Preliminary Dance Test but no higher than the Pre-Bronze Dance Test.

FIESTA TANGO

Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Bronze Dance Test, but no higher than the Bronze Dance Test.

HICKORY HOEDOWN

Open to skaters who passed the Bronze Dance Test, but no higher than the Pre-Silver Dance Test.

FOXTROT

Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Silver Dance Test, but no higher than the Silver Dance Test.

TANGO

Open to skaters who have passed the Silver Dance Test, but no higher than the Pre-Gold Dance Test.

ARTISTIC EVENTS

This event is to be skated as a rhythmic interpretation of the music selected by the skater. Each program will be considered in terms of the composition (conformity with the music, variety and utilization of the ice) and presentation (originality and expression of the character of the music). Note that entertainment and skating difficulty of the technical elements of the program are not value factors. ***Credit for jumps and spins will be based solely on their choreographic effectiveness. Single jumps, including the Axel and one double jump are permitted; however the allowable content of the skater's free skating program may not be exceeded. All skaters in these artistic events must skate at the same level as their free skating event. THIS IS NOT A COSTUME EVENT.*** Skating attire is to be in accordance with the current US Figure Skating Rule Book. Props and scenery are not allowed. Artistic music may include vocal arrangements. **At the discretion of the referee, groups may be combined and/or divided according to the number of skaters entered. Boys and Girls may compete against one another in this event at all levels below Pre-Preliminary. The 6.0 system of judging will be used for this event.**
