The Skating Club of Phoenix is pleased to announce our 34th Annual Phoenix Fiesta Skate Competition. The conduct of this competition will be in accordance with US Figure Skating rules and regulations prescribed in the 2010 - 2011 Official US Figure Skating Rulebook, except as noted in this announcement. Any changes in the rules or schedules will be posted online at www.skatingclubofphoenix.com, and will be considered sufficient notice to all competitors and officials.

Events will be offered in:

- Singles: Basic Skills Snowplow through Freeskate 6
- Singles: Competitive Test Track Pre-Preliminary – Senior, and Adult Pre-Bronze – Silver
- Singles and Pairs: Short Program and Well-Balanced Free Skating (No Test - Senior and Adult Gold & Masters)
- Ice Dance: Ice Dance, Solo Dance, and Dance-with-your-Coach
- Showcase: (Artistic Light and Dramatic)
- Compulsory Moves: Basic 1 – Open/Juvenile
- Special Olympics Skater Free Skate and Showcase

CONDUCT OF THE COMPETITION

The decision of the referee on all matters will be final. The referee, along with the competition chairperson, shall have the right to exclude any person whose behavior is unruly or unsportsmanlike.

All skating level, test and age requirements are as of the date of close of entries, and will be strictly enforced. Skaters will not be seeded in this competition. All skating durations will be in accordance with Rules 3640 through 4511. If you have questions, please call the Registrar prior to mailing your application.

There will be a final round for open/pre-juvenile and higher events if there is more than one Skating Group. There will be **no** final round for any Competitive Test Track event, or No-Test, Pre-Preliminary, or Preliminary Free Skate Well-Balanced events. Skaters will not be seeded in this competition. Division of Juvenile through Senior events into Qualifying Round Groups will be by random draw. The number of qualifying groups and number of skaters advancing to the Final Round will be in accordance with Rule 3280. Qualifying Round for Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior levels will consist of the Short Program and Free Skate. Final round will consist of Free Skate only. We will be using the Short Program required elements and Free Skate well-balanced program requirements for the **2010-2011** season (due to competition being after US Championships).

All Well-Balanced program events Open/Juvenile through Senior singles and pairs require that a **Planned Program Content Form** be completed online at www.usfigureskating.org/ or via email, snail mail, or hand delivery to the Registrar, by Wednesday, April 7, 2010 by 9pm . Skaters not submitting PPCs by this date will be assessed an incomplete application fee of \$30.00, which must be paid in cash at the registration desk in order to compete.

SKATING LEVEL

- First place winners in the 2009 Phoenix Fiesta Skate freeskate levels *No-Test through Pre-Juvenile* must move up one level higher, regardless of test level.
- Skaters in artistic events may choose to skate one level higher than their submitted freeskate level for this competition.
- Juvenile level skaters who have passed Intermediate MIF or higher may enter the Intermediate short program event since they are unable to compete in the Juvenile compulsory moves events. They will still be able to compete in the Open/Juvenile freeskate events.
- Male skaters will be combined with female skaters in all artistic events, and Basic Skills free skate levels if needed to make an event. Single entries for male skaters in Pre-Pre through Senior free skate levels will be contacted to choose exhibition or refund.

ICE SURFACE

The competition will be held at **Polar Ice Peoria**, located at 15829 N. 83rd Avenue, Peoria, AZ, 85382. The competition ice surface (the "North Pole") is indoors and measures 80' x 200' with slightly rounded corners. The South Pole ice surface is Olympic size.

ELIGIBILITY

Phoenix Fiesta Skate is open to all eligible US Figure Skating members. A current member is:

1. A full club or individual member of US Figure Skating OR
2. A current US Figure Skating Basic Skills member (enrolled now or in the current membership year in group classes through a member US Figure Skating Basic Skills rink)

Note: ISI members must also be US Figure Skating members to compete.

ENTRIES

The entry fee MUST accompany the completed entry form and be received by no later than – March 6, 2010. *We encourage use of the online system over mailed entries and checks. Paper entries will be assessed an additional \$5 fee per event.* Online entry with secure credit card payment is available at <http://www.skatingclubofphoenix.com> Online entry must be completed by midnight on March 6, 2010. Entries received after that date will be accepted only at the discretion of the LOC and will be assessed a \$30 late fee.

"Notification of competition and practice ice times will NOT be available by phone, mail, or email. Skater and Coaches schedules will be available via the web at <http://www.skatingclubofphoenix.com> "

The entry fee must accompany the completed entry form if mailed OR the fee must be paid via credit card **immediately following your online application submittal** if you choose to use our online registration process. Checks must be made payable to the **Skating Club of Phoenix**.

Refunds will only be issued if the competition event is not held. Two entries constitute an event. The Referee reserves the right to combine non-freeskate events in order to make an event. If an event is cancelled due to lack of participation, a refund will be issued. If you paid by credit card, the refund will be issued to the credit card - if you paid by check the refund will be issued at the Registration desk upon skater check-in, or will be mailed if the skater won't be competing at all. **ABSOLUTELY NO REFUNDS WILL BE ISSUED EXCEPT FOR THE ABOVE NOTED REASON..**

NOTE: A \$25 fee will be charged if any check is returned due to insufficient funds. In addition, the skater will not be permitted to skate until the appropriate fees have been paid (CASH OR MONEY ORDER ONLY), including the \$25 returned check fee.

A tentative "Groups List with Levels" will be posted online approximately two weeks after the close of entries for the purpose of coach/skater verification of correct level/events. Corrections/changes to the levels/events must be made by the posted deadline. A tentative schedule of events will be posted approximately four weeks before the start of the competition. Please check the website at <http://www.skatingclubofphoenix.com> frequently, especially in the two weeks before the competition for official notices, changes, and special events that may be scheduled.

JUDGING

The closed system of judging will be used for all events. The IJS system will be used to judge all singles and pairs short program and free skating events in the Intermediate through Senior, Juvenile/Open Juvenile and Adult Gold/Master levels. The 6.0 system will be used to judge the remaining events.

COACHES

Coaches accompanying skaters must be:

- 1) a US Figure Skating Registered coach in good standing. Coach registration cards will be checked if the coach's name is not on the most current USFS Registered Coach list on the USFS website.
- 2) A member of US Figure Skating as a club member or individual member

Coaches MUST wear credentials. Only coaches with credentials will be allowed in the practice ice coaching areas, and in the competitor entry area prior to events.

REGISTRATION

A registration desk will be located at the entrance of the rink. Competitors should register upon arrival and must check in/turn in music at least 45 minutes before each event to be skated. The competition schedule will be posted at the desk. There is no admission charge for spectators. Copies of results pages and IJS skater event summaries will be available at the Registration desk for a nominal fee.

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

Please do not make travel arrangements until the schedule has been announced. If the number of entrants is lower than expected, the competition could start on Friday, April 9, 2010.

MUSIC

Do not leave CDs in the Arizona sun, especially on your dashboard, as damage may occur. Music will be played from CD-R or mini disc with one (1) track ONLY, and must be plainly marked with the skater's name and event. Please do not use CD-RW CDs since there may be problems in playing them. Music must be turned in at the registration desk at least 45 minutes prior to the event to be skated. After the event, music should be picked up at the registration desk. **Carry a back-up CD copy of your music at all times in case of emergency.** The music committee will not accept responsibility for any breakage, but will take every precaution to safeguard your music. CDs left after the conclusion of the competition will be discarded.

SPECIAL AWARDS

Skating Club Of Phoenix Memorial Trophy This trophy is dedicated to all home club members who are deceased, and awarded annually at Fiesta Skate. It is hoped that this trophy will encourage artistic interpretation of music by our younger skaters. The trophy will be awarded to the skater, who in the opinion of the judges, has presented the most artistic performance in the Intermediate Level free skating event. Recipients will have their names engraved on the Memorial Trophy which will remain at the Club rink, Polar Ice Peoria, Arizona. A plaque will be presented to the winner.

The Rising Star Award The most outstanding performance at the Pre-Preliminary level. An engraved trophy, with the recipient's name inscribed on it, remains on display at the Club rink. A plaque will be presented to the winner.

The Basic Skills Rising Star Award The most outstanding free skating performance in the Freeski 1 through Freeski 6 levels. A plaque will be presented to the winner.

PRACTICE ICE

Skaters will be able to pick their own practice ice sessions online but you **MUST** indicate number of sessions you want on the practice ice form or online when you register and you **MUST** pay for them with your entry form or when you register online. You will receive an email with a PIN number in order to access your practice ice records and select your sessions. The cost is \$15.00 per session if you **pre-reserve online**, the cost is \$18.00 per session if mailed in. Practice ice will be scheduled at the rink starting on each day of the competition depending on the competition schedule. Please indicate the number of sessions you would like online or complete the Practice Ice Reservation Form and return it, with payment, with your competition application. We will allow additional practice ice sales online for \$18.00 per session after the schedule has been posted and those that pre-register for sessions have had time to select their sessions. Additional practice ice will be available for purchase during the competition and will cost \$20.00 at the Registration Desk

PHOTOGRAPHER An official photographer and award presenter for Phoenix Fiesta Skate will be present. Pictures will be taken on the podium. Packages will be made available during the competition. Flash photography is not permitted during the events for the safety of the skaters.

BASIC PROGRAM EVENT: SNOWPLOW SAM – BASIC 8

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise specified.

To be skated on full ice

Vocal music is allowed

The skater may use elements from a previous level

A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times element is executed, or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise stated. Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program.

Vocal music is allowed.

The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use but is not required to use any additional elements from previous levels

Intermediate through Senior level skaters may skate the Combined SP/FS event, or skate Short Program Only event, or Freeskate Only event. Only the Combined event will have a final round. Open/Juvenile level freeskate skaters who have passed the Juvenile FS test **and** the Intermediate or higher MIF test may compete in the Intermediate Short Program Only event.

EVENTS – “COMPETITIVE TEST TRACK” FREE SKATE MUSIC EVENT

The 6.0 judging system will be used. Skaters may choose to participate in either the Test Track or Well-Balanced Free Skating Track, but not both during the same non-qualifying competition. Deductions will be taken if skaters include technical elements that are not permitted in the event. There are no final rounds for Test Track events. Vocal music permitted. Skaters must be 20 years of age or younger by close of entries.

EVENTS – ADULT COMPETITIVE TEST TRACK FREE SKATE

Competitors may enter EITHER the new test track or the well balanced free skate track but NOT both. Deductions will be taken if skaters include technical elements which are not permitted in the event. All Free Skate times are +/- 10 seconds. There are no final rounds for Test Track events. All skaters must be 21 years of age or older by close of entries.

EVENTS - ADULT WELL-BALANCED FREE SKATE

The Competition Organizers reserve the right to combine events in the case of a single entry in any group. The combined group will free skate the items from the lower group. Men and women will be separated. *Minimum age: 21 years old. Note that +/- 10-second time allowances do not apply to Adult Events, time listed is maximum time allowed.*

 - c) Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile Test Track skaters entering artistic events will skate in a combined-level event, with only single jumps (but no axels) allowed.
 - d) Collegiate age skaters (skaters age 18-20) will skate in the following levels:

 - ii) Preliminary skate in Adult Bronze

Junior Pairs - Short Program duration maximum 2:50 minutes. Free Skate duration 4:00 minutes. Refer to Rule 4050-4052. IJS judging.

Senior Pairs - Short Program duration maximum 2:50 minutes. Free Skate duration 4:30 minutes. Refer to Rule 4040-4042. IJS judging.

Adult Pairs event can be added upon request prior to close of entries.

EVENTS - ICE DANCE

The events will be conducted according to 2009-10 Rulebook Rules 4200 through 4511. No ODs will be skated. Free Dance events will be conducted in accordance with Rule 4270-4272. There are no age restrictions. *Compulsory dances will be those drawn for the 2010-11 season, per rule 4230-43, and skated in the order listed in the rulebook.* All skate orders will be decided by a random draw. Judging is 6.0.

Hickory Hoedown: Skater must have passed no higher than the Pre-Silver Dance Test.

Foxtrot: Skater must have passed no higher than the Silver Dance Test.

American Waltz: Skater must have passed no higher than the Pre-Gold Dance Test.

Kilian: OPEN TO ALL.

Argentine Tango: OPEN TO ALL.

Rhumba: OPEN TO ALL.

EVENTS - DANCE WITH YOUR COACH – TWO PATTERNS

Rhythm Blues, Cha Cha, Willow Waltz, Silver Tango, Paso Doble, or Quickstep. This is a fun event where the skater and not the coach will be judged. Skaters may skate up to the higher level, but may not skate the Rhythm Blues if they have passed the complete Pre-Bronze Dance, or the Cha Cha if they have passed the complete Bronze dance.

Special Skater Freeskate 4	Program must include at least 9 of the following skills: Forward outside 3 turn, forward inside Mohawk turn, lunge, shoot the duck, bunny hop, waltz jump, spiral, forward pivot, sit-spin, camel spin, 1 foot spin, T-stop. 2 minutes.
Special Skater Freeskate 5	A well-balanced program that includes jumps, spins, and footwork elements from the previous levels, and may include: single rotation jumps, single rotation jump combinations or sequences, and combination spins that change position and/or foot. 2:30 min. No Axel allowed.

Special Skater Showcase Events

The Showcase event is designed to portray a character or theme through music and costume. Costumes must be in good taste. Only hand held props are permitted and may be placed on the ice. **NO ON ICE PROPS WILL BE ALLOWED.** Skaters will be judged using only the second mark of the 6.0 system. There will be five levels of Special Skater Showcase events, which correspond to the Special Skater Freeskate levels. There are no required elements. Duration: 1:30 minutes, +/- 10 seconds for all levels.
